1 CHAIRMAN TANELLI: The meeting is
2 called to order.

3 Will the Clerk please read the Sen.
4 Byron Baer Open Public Meetings Act.

5 MS. SCIANCALEPORE: In accordance with
6 Section 5 of the Sen. Byron Baer Open Public Meetings
7 Act, adequate notice of this meeting has been
8 provided in the Annual Notice Schedule, which
9 contained the time, date, and location of this
10 meeting, copies of which Notices were forwarded to
11 the official County newspapers, to wit: The Herald
12 News; The Record; and the Star Ledger, and a copy of
13 which was posted on the bulletin board in the Bergen
14 County Justice Center and Administration Building,
15 One Bergen County Plaza, Hackensack, New Jersey, and
16 filed with the Office of the Bergen County Clerk.

17 ROLL CALL:

18 CHAIRMAN TANELLI: Will the Clerk
19 please call the roll.

20 (At this point in the proceeding roll
21 call is taken with Freeholders DeNicola, Ganz,
22 Sullivan, Voss, Vice-Chairwoman Zur, and Chairman
23 Tanelli present, with Freeholder Felice absent.)

24 CHAIRMAN TANELLI: I would just remind
25 everyone please silence your phones.

1 PLEDGE OF ALLEGIANCE:

2 CHAIRMAN TANELLI: Please rise for the
3 Pledge.

4 County Executive, will you please read
5 lead us.

6 COUNTY EXECUTIVE TEDESCO: Thank you,
7 Chairman.

8 Ladies and gentlemen, please honor
9 America.

10 (At this point in the proceeding all
11 rise for a recitation of the Pledge of Allegiance,
12 led by County Executive Tedesco.)

13 4:43 PM PRESENTATION FOR RESOLUTIONS #338-16 AND

14 #339-16:

15 CHAIRMAN TANELLI: So I'm going to go a
16 little out of order here, if that's okay with
17 everyone. What I'd like to do now is to present a
18 commendation, a presentation to the representatives
19 of the Bergen County Alternatives to Domestic
20 Violence, the healingSPACE, and the Center for Hope
21 and Safety, #338-16 and #339-16.

22 So if you'd like to vote on those
23 resolutions first.

24 MS. SCIANCALEPORE: Do you want to do
25 them on Consent or Body of the Whole?

1 CHAIRMAN TANELLI: Body of the Whole,
2 if that's okay with everyone.

3 FREEHOLDER DeNICOLA: That's okay.

4 FREEHOLDER GANZ: So moved.

5 VICE-CHAIRWOMAN ZUR: Second.

6 MS. SCIANCALEPORE: #338-16 is a
7 "Resolution Recognizing April 2016 as Sexual
8 Harassment Awareness Month," and Resolution #339-16
9 is a "Resolution authorizing to deny parole to
10 Christopher Righetti."

11 CHAIRMAN TANELLI: I have a motion and
12 second, please call the roll.

13 (At this point in the proceeding roll
14 call is taken and Resolutions #338-16 and #339-16 are
15 passed by a vote of six in favor, with Freeholder
16 Felice absent.)

17 CHAIRMAN TANELLI: So we just passed
18 two resolutions. We have a resolution from the
19 Board, I'm not going to read it all, as always, I'm
20 just going to pick a couple of paragraphs out.

21 "Whereas, the United States Department
22 of Justice defines sexual assault as any type of
23 sexual contact or behavior that occurs without the
24 explicit consent of the recipient; and

25 "Whereas, the impact of rape, sexual

1 assault, sexual abuse, and sexual harassment is felt
2 throughout Bergen County, and statistics show one in
3 six women and one in 33 men have been a victim of
4 rape or an attempted rape in their lifetime; and

5 "Whereas, Bergen County Alternatives to
6 Domestic Violence provides services to victims of
7 domestic violence and makes connections to outside
8 agencies, such as healingSPACE, Center for Hope and
9 Safety, and Bergen Family Center, that offer support
10 to survivors of sexual assault through services; and

11 "Whereas, the citizens in Bergen County
12 must work in concert to advise one another on
13 sounding off against hurtful behavior and acts,
14 helping survivors of sexual assault, and the
15 prevention of sexual assault.

16 "Be it further resolved that the Bergen
17 County Board of Chosen Freeholders does hereby
18 recognize and commend the above-mentioned
19 healingSPACE, Center for Hope and Safety, Bergen
20 Family Center, and Bergen County Alternatives to
21 Domestic Violence for their efforts and commitment to
22 the survivors of sexual violence, the prevention of
23 sexual violence, and raising awareness about sexual
24 violence."

25 This will be distributed to each one of

1 those associations.

2 I understand that Mariam Gerges,
3 program manager of healingSPACE, a sexual violence
4 resource center for the YMCA of Bergen County, would
5 like to address the Board.

6 FREEHOLDER DeNICOLA: Mr. Chairman, can
7 I just say a few words to begin?

8 CHAIRMAN TANELLI: Sure.

9 FREEHOLDER DeNICOLA: This resolution
10 actually came about through Mariam Gerges and her
11 positive energy in approaching a topic that's so
12 important to everyone, and unfortunately one where
13 we're seeing a growing number of women and men who
14 are being assaulted every year. Mariam is the
15 program director of healingSPACE, which, as many of
16 you know, used to be called the Rape Crisis Center
17 out of the Bergen County YWCA.

18 Mariam worked with John Collins. I
19 have to give him a shout-out. And, of course, we
20 connected with ADV, Alternatives to Domestic
21 Violence, Dave Cohen, and Susan and Alan are also
22 here. And we have the new Executive Director of the
23 Center for Hope and Safety, Julie Myner as well, the
24 new Elaine Meyerson. And I'm sorry to say that to
25 you, but you are forging your own path over there and

1 doing wonderful things as well.

2 So in an effort to kickoff April right
3 from the get-go, thank you, Mr. Chairman, for
4 allowing this resolution to be on our agenda today.

5 CHAIRMAN TANELLI: Thank you. It's
6 very important. If you'd like to please address the
7 Board.

8 MS. GERGES: I just want to say thank
9 you to everybody for supporting Sexual Assault
10 Awareness Month, and, as Maura was saying, a lot of
11 people are affected by sexual violence. I'm sure
12 everybody in this room has either been affected or
13 knows somebody who has been affected by sexual
14 violence. Unfortunately, it is a taboo topic
15 sometimes that people don't want to talk about.
16 There's a lot of shame and guilty associated with
17 sexual violence, which prevents a lot of people from
18 speaking up. But through raising awareness, we're
19 able to kind of destigmatize the issues around sexual
20 violence and encourage survivors to speak up and to
21 get the support that they need, which is what we do
22 at healingSPACE, we provide prevention, we provide
23 education, and we provide counseling services to
24 survivors and their significant others so that they
25 are able to process the trauma that they've been

1 through. And without everybody's help here in this
2 room and without raising awareness, we wouldn't be
3 able to do the work that we do. So I want to say on
4 behalf of the YWCA healingSPACE, thank you very much.

5 CHAIRMAN TANELLI: Thank you.

6 VICE-CHAIRWOMAN ZUR: Thank you.

7 CHAIRMAN TANELLI: I'd like to invite
8 the County Executive, who also would like to make a
9 presentation.

10 COUNTY EXECUTIVE TEDESCO: Sure.

11 Thank you, Mr. Chairman, and members of
12 the Board. Thank you for allowing me to be able to
13 come in front of you today to give a proclamation to
14 the four groups that you've just talked about.

15 And while the Chairman read statistics,
16 I'm not going to read our entire proclamation, but I
17 do want to say, first of all, thank you. Thank you
18 to not only ADV and Hope and Safety and the
19 healingSPACE and Bergen Family Center, but to
20 everybody that volunteers too, because they're the
21 ones that help make a difference.

22 And I always talk about how one person
23 can make a difference. And if you really believe in
24 something, then you can change or make someone's life
25 better or bring something good out of something bad.

1 And so that's why I always talk about having passion
2 and we talked about the stigma behind it. And, you
3 know, the county and many towns in Bergen County have
4 moved past that and are talking about mental health
5 issues and things like that and removing the stigma
6 from that. And we need to get to the same place for
7 sexual assault, so people feel that they can come and
8 talk to people about it and not hide from it.

9 So I'm happy that the county is able to
10 at least recognize those of you that are out there in
11 the forefront doing this, and that we can get past
12 the stigma, but more so we can eliminate this,
13 because women and men shouldn't be afraid of being
14 assaulted and attacked.

15 So I'm not going to read the
16 proclamation in total, I'm just going to read the
17 last paragraph, and then I'll present it to you.

18 It says:

19 "Whereas, Bergen County Alternatives to
20 Domestic Violence provides services to victims of
21 domestic violence while making connections to outside
22 agencies such as healingSPACE, the Center for Hope
23 and Safety, and Bergen Family Center, that offers
24 support to survivors of sexual assault; and

25 "Whereas, Bergen County commends these

1 organizations for their efforts and commitment to the
2 survivors of sexual violence, the prevention of
3 sexual violence, and raising awareness about sexual
4 violence.

5 "Now, therefore, be it proclaimed that
6 I, James J. Tedesco, III, the Executive of the County
7 of Bergen in the State of New Jersey, do hereby
8 proclaim April 2016 as 'Sexual Assault Awareness
9 Month' in the County of Bergen."

10 So I have a proclamation for each one
11 of the groups. You want to come up, and I'll give
12 you the proclamation.

13 (Whereupon, the presentation is made.)

14 4:51 PM PUBLIC COMMENT:

15 CHAIRMAN TANELLI: May I have a motion
16 to open the meeting to the public?

17 FREEHOLDER GANZ: So moved.

18 FREEHOLDER VOSS: So moved.

19 Second.

20 CHAIRMAN TANELLI: All in favor?

21 (All present Freeholders respond in the
22 affirmative.)

23 CHAIRMAN TANELLI: Opposed?

24 (No response.)

25 CHAIRMAN TANELLI: The ayes have it.

1 We'll now have a Hearing of the General
2 Public, with a three-minute time limit in effect.
3 The Board Attorney will keep the time.

4 Anyone wishing to speak?

5 Sure.

6 MR. GAUTIER: Hello, Freeholders. How
7 are you?

8 FREEHOLDER DeNICOLA: Good, Joe. How
9 are you?

10 MR. GAUTIER: Good.

11 Nice to see all of you.

12 I wanted to come here today and speak
13 to you a little bit about a situation at our senior
14 centers.

15 Now, I know you all care very much
16 about what happens within our senior centers and the
17 communities that they serve.

18 You know, they don't only serve meals
19 and play bingo with these people, they provide
20 numerous, numerous programs for them. I know you
21 know that, because I know you visited there and
22 sometimes played bingo. I know Freeholder Zur, it's
23 her favorite, but...

24 FREEHOLDER SULLIVAN: She never wins.

25 FREEHOLDER ZUR: I call the numbers.

1 MR. GAUTIER: Yes.

2 So one of the things we did was we were
3 thinking, you know, reduced staffing levels means
4 reduced programs in these centers. But, you know, it
5 was just a theory. So what we did was we put
6 together a staffing report on these senior centers,
7 and I'd like to give all of you a copy of this today.

8 CHAIRMAN TANELLI: Please.

9 MR. GAUTIER: So I would appreciate if
10 you'd take a look at it and consider it, when you
11 consider decisions on the budget this year.

12 You know, there's things we could do to
13 help the programs but also keep costs under control,
14 because I realize there are budgetary issues. So if
15 any of you would like to meet with me on these
16 issues, I would be more than happy. Okay?

17 FREEHOLDER DeNICOLA: Great. Can I ask
18 you, Mr. Chairman, a quick question?

19 CHAIRMAN TANELLI: Sure.

20 MR. GAUTIER: Yes.

21 FREEHOLDER DeNICOLA: I know I am
22 getting some complaints from constituents about
23 reduced programming at the centers and I know budget
24 time is coming too, which is really important. Can
25 you speak to the numbers of seniors who are utilizing

1 the center? Is that in here?

2 MR. GAUTIER: That is all in there.

3 FREEHOLDER DeNICOLA: Great.

4 MR. GAUTIER: There are actually graphs
5 on not only activities, but also on meals served.

6 FREEHOLDER DeNICOLA: Great.

7 MR. GAUTIER: It's pretty
8 comprehensive.

9 FREEHOLDER DeNICOLA: Great. Thank
10 you. Okay. Thank you.

11 MR. GAUTIER: No problem. Okay. Thank
12 you very much.

13 CHAIRMAN TANELLI: Anyone else?

14 MS. CHRISTMAS: Yes.

15 CHAIRMAN TANELLI: Okay.

16 MS. CHRISTMAS: Selena, S-E-L-E-N-A,
17 Christmas, like the holiday.

18 Good afternoon.

19 CHAIRMAN TANELLI: Good afternoon.

20 FREEHOLDER DeNICOLA: Good afternoon.

21 MS. CHRISTMAS: I'm here because I have
22 a situation with the Bergen County Board of Social
23 Services.

24 I've been complaining to them for years
25 about my taxes that they continuously take, when I

1 paid them back.

2 I had a situation where I had to go to
3 court, the judge didn't like it, because I was sick,
4 he thought I was going to die. I had cancer. But he
5 told me if I had a problem, that I could go back to
6 court, I can request to go back to court.

7 I allowed them to take money, because I
8 didn't really feel like being bothered. I
9 volunteered to give them money, and they keep giving
10 me the runaround, and I just lost a spot at
11 Fairleigh, going into New York for a course that I
12 greatly needed, because they put a stop on my taxes,
13 when I'm giving them money. And I wrote a letter to
14 you, Ms. Zur, and to Chris. I sent it weeks ago.
15 And I have not gotten a response. And today, just by
16 accident, I found out that there was this meeting.

17 VICE-CHAIRWOMAN ZUR: I haven't seen
18 the letter from you, Ms. Christmas, and I would
19 remember you, because I dealt directly with you when
20 I was public defender of Englewood, so I would have
21 had to recuse myself regarding any situation in which
22 you are involved. So, no, I have not received it,
23 but I will make sure Freeholder Sullivan, who also
24 sits on the Board of Social Services with me,
25 addresses the situation -- I'm sorry, Freeholder

1 Voss.

2 FREEHOLDER SULLIVAN: I don't sit
3 there.

4 VICE-CHAIRWOMAN ZUR: Freeholder Voss.

5 MS. CHRISTMAS: Is there anything I
6 should do that I haven't done?

7 VICE-CHAIRWOMAN ZUR: If you have a
8 copy of the letter and wish to leave it with us?

9 MS. CHRISTMAS: No. I just found out
10 about the meeting when I was leaving class, when I
11 called to speak to you or Chris, and you were out and
12 he was out, and I have a copy of the letter at home.

13 VICE-CHAIRWOMAN ZUR: Email that to us.

14 CHAIRMAN TANELLI: Why don't we, at the
15 conclusion of this, which should be relatively
16 soon --

17 MS. CHRISTMAS: I can check my flash
18 drive and see if I have a copy on my flash drive.

19 CHAIRMAN TANELLI: What we'll do, we'll
20 discuss this offline with you after the meeting. The
21 meeting should be over shortly.

22 MS. CHRISTMAS: Okay. Thank you very
23 much.

24 FREEHOLDER SULLIVAN: The County
25 Executive.

1 CHAIRMAN TANELLI: State your name and
2 address for the record.

3 COUNTY EXECUTIVE TEDESCO: Thank you.

4 I just want to address the issue that
5 was raised earlier about the senior centers, and I
6 thank you for putting the report together and doing
7 due diligence on your side.

8 The goal for the administration is to
9 provide all the services that we can, especially at
10 senior centers. And while there have been
11 retirements and there's been budgetary constraints,
12 it is the administration's goal to continue to
13 provide a myriad of services.

14 Now, that doesn't mean that individual
15 centers, based on the director being there, that they
16 may not take an action to curtail one or to do
17 something with one versus another facility, because
18 if that's what fits within that center.

19 The administration is working
20 diligently on the Midland Park center and
21 specifically to address that issue with its staffing,
22 and we believe that very shortly we'll have a
23 resolution for that one specific center. But I just
24 want to make sure that there's not a misunderstanding
25 here that the administration is cutting services from

1 seniors or at senior centers. That's not the goal of
2 this administration. The goal is actually to
3 hopefully increase the amount of services that we can
4 provide and activities that we can provide. But each
5 center is run by an individual that makes the best
6 business decision for those centers, and so there
7 will be differences at each one of those centers.

8 So I look forward to working with Joe
9 and with the Freeholder Board on a budget that will
10 reflect the commitment that we have to seniors.

11 CHAIRMAN TANELLI: Thank you.

12 COUNTY EXECUTIVE TEDESCO: Thank you,
13 Chairman.

14 CHAIRMAN TANELLI: I'd like to just add
15 on the record that having been involved with my local
16 senior centers heavily as I was, that the previous
17 administration had made decisions that curtailed a
18 lot of the activities that was taking place in those
19 senior centers, where I was hearing quite a bit of
20 grumbling for the course of the four years. This
21 administration has now tried to move forward from
22 that and actually enhance those programs, and I think
23 we've done a great job.

24 We've worked with one of the
25 communities where the community actually pays for

1 their rent, the municipality pays their rent. The
2 county is working with them to make sure that that
3 building stays open, as times get tougher for
4 municipalities to pay. So I'd like to thank you for
5 your efforts.

6 COUNTY EXECUTIVE TEDESCO: No, not a
7 problem.

8 The other thing is when I was in
9 before, just for everyone, the YWCA will sponsor the
10 Clothesline Project with the shirts April 6th here at
11 the building.

12 MS. GERGES: Okay.

13 COUNTY EXECUTIVE TEDESCO: I forgot to
14 announce that earlier. I'm sorry, Chairman.

15 CHAIRMAN TANELLI: Freeholder Ganz.

16 FREEHOLDER GANZ: I just want to say
17 that this is the 12th or 13th week of the year, and
18 this is I believe the eighth time that you've
19 appeared before the Freeholder Board, which is seven
20 times longer and more than the previous Executive. I
21 congratulate you on your openness and your abilities
22 to work with this Board.

23 COUNTY EXECUTIVE TEDESCO: Thank you.
24 I think it's important that we continue the dialogue
25 that we started. So thank you again.

1 CHAIRMAN TANELLI: Thank you.

2 FREEHOLDER SULLIVAN: Chairman, I just
3 want to put on the record too that certainly we've
4 done nothing, since I've been on this Board, done
5 nothing but enhance the programs, we will strive for
6 that as well --

7 CHAIRMAN TANELLI: Thank you.

8 FREEHOLDER SULLIVAN: -- a continuation
9 of that.

10 FREEHOLDER DeNICOLA: I just want to
11 add.

12 CHAIRMAN TANELLI: Okay.

13 FREEHOLDER DeNICOLA: And this isn't
14 one administration versus another, but I think we've
15 been looking at diminishing staffing over time with
16 an increasing senior population and trying to do more
17 with less, and that's one of the challenges.

18 FREEHOLDER SULLIVAN: We certainly
19 haven't cut the budgets there, and that's not our
20 intention, period.

21 CHAIRMAN TANELLI: Okay.

22 MR. FLORIO: Chairman, before we
23 adjourn, let me just point out, because --

24 CHAIRMAN TANELLI: Obviously, I didn't
25 close or open it.

1 MR. FLORIO: I thought there was a
2 motion to close.

3 CHAIRMAN TANELLI: No one else wishing
4 to speak?

5 Okay. Can I have a motion to close?

6 FREEHOLDER VOSS: So moved.

7 FREEHOLDER GANZ: So moved.

8 CHAIRMAN TANELLI: Second?

9 VICE-CHAIRWOMAN ZUR: Second.

10 CHAIRMAN TANELLI: All in favor?

11 (All present Freeholders respond in the
12 affirmative.)

13 CHAIRMAN TANELLI: Opposed?

14 (No response.)

15 CHAIRMAN TANELLI: The ayes have it,
16 the meeting is now closed to the public.

17 Counsel.

18 MR. FLORIO: I have a concern about
19 some of the information that may be included in the
20 document that was just distributed. And so, as not
21 to cause any panic or alarm, I would like to advise
22 all the Freeholders not to distribute these documents
23 to the public. I don't want to collect them, but I'd
24 like to review them before anybody shares any of the
25 information that may be contained therein so as not

1 to cause any issues with respect to personnel who are
2 employees of the County of Bergen.

3 CHAIRMAN TANELLI: Okay.

4 MR. FLORIO: Thank you, Chairman.

5 5:05 PM RESOLUTION #340-16:

6 CHAIRMAN TANELLI: Will the Clerk
7 please read the remaining resolution.

8 MS. SCIANCALEPORE: Resolution #340-16
9 is a resolution authorizing appointment of Gerald L.
10 Carroll as a member of the Board of Trustees of
11 Bergen Community College.

12 CHAIRMAN TANELLI: May I have a motion?

13 FREEHOLDER GANZ: So moved.

14 VICE-CHAIRWOMAN ZUR: Second.

15 CHAIRMAN TANELLI: Please call the
16 roll.

17 FREEHOLDER DeNICOLA: Just discussion
18 on the motion.

19 We only have one. We had a phone call
20 we were going to have two.

21 CHAIRMAN TANELLI: Yes, the other one
22 wasn't prepared yet.

23 FREEHOLDER DeNICOLA: Okay.

24 CHAIRMAN TANELLI: So we're only able
25 to present this one.

1 And just for the record, the other one
2 was a reappointment, so it's not harm to the board.
3 He'll be just a holdover for the next meeting, if we
4 don't get it on for the next meeting.

5 FREEHOLDER DeNICOLA: And then his
6 resolution will be on for the next meeting?

7 CHAIRMAN TANELLI: Yes.

8 FREEHOLDER DeNICOLA: Okay.

9 CHAIRMAN TANELLI: Call the roll,
10 please.

11 (At this point in the proceeding roll
12 call is taken and Resolution #340-16 is passed by a
13 vote of six in favor, with Freeholder Felice absent.)

14 CHAIRMAN TANELLI: Are there any
15 Resolutions on Nonconsent, pulled or tabled?

16 MS. SCIANCALEPORE: No, there are not.

17 CHAIRMAN TANELLI: Okay. Great.

18 So there being nothing further to come
19 before this meeting, may I have a motion to adjourn?

20 FREEHOLDER GANZ: So moved.

21 FREEHOLDER SULLIVAN: So moved.

22 VICE-CHAIRWOMAN ZUR: Second.
