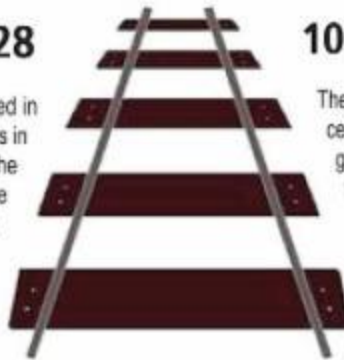
# How Immigration & the Railroad Shaped Our Towns
