Bergen Freeholders Swear in New Members, Appoint Zur as Chairwoman



HACKENSACK- The Bergen County Board of Chosen Freeholders on Wednesday, January 4th, 2017 held its Annual Reorganization meeting, swearing in Freeholders Mary J. Amoroso (D- Mahwah), Germaine M. Ortiz (D- Emerson), and Thomas J. Sullivan (D-Montvale) for their first full three-year terms.

The Freeholders also elected their leadership, as the members unanimously supported Freeholder Tracy Silna Zur (D- Franklin Lakes) for the position of Board Chairwoman. Sullivan was also sworn in as Vice-Chairman of the Board.

“I’m incredibly honored by the trust my colleagues have placed in me to serve as Chair this year,” said Zur, now entering her 5th year on the Freeholder Board. “I plan to continue the leadership that this board has championed, delivering good government and implementing policies that make a difference in the lives of Bergen County residents.
