Two educational videos recently added to the Bergen County Health Promotion Resource Center focus on sex education. Both present information concerning abstinence as well as safer sex.

Hope is Not a Method

The setting is a family planning clinic. Two couples and one woman accompanied by a friend come to the clinic to talk with counselors about various methods of birth control. Detailed information explains how each method is used correctly. Revised by United Learning in 2002, this video can be used with grades 9 through adults.

A teacher's guide and blackline masters on methods of contraception are available.

STDs, AIDS, and the Clean Love Solution

Follow two urban teens on their quest for information about sexually transmitted diseases. They learn about transmission, symptoms and treatment of STDs. Alternatives to sexual involvement, as well as refusal skills, are presented. Intended for students in grades 7 - 12, this video was produced by United Learning in 1997.

A teacher's guide includes follow up questions and black-line masters.

NEW CURRICULUM SUPPLEMENTS FROM THE NATIONAL INSTITUTES OF HEALTH

In July 2002, the National Institutes of Health released three curriculum supplements, available to teachers of students in in grades 1 to 12. These supplements are:

The Brain: Understanding Neurobiology Through the Study of Addiction. Allows students in grades 9 through 12 to explore how drugs alter brain function by changing the way neurons communicate.

Chemicals, the Environment and You: Explorations in Science and Human Health. Enables students in grades 7 and 8 to explore the relationship between chemicals in the environment and human health, utilizing basic concepts in the science of toxicology.

Open Wide and Trek Inside. Encourages students in grades 1 and 2 to gain understanding of the mouth as a living environment and learn major scientific concepts relating to oral health.
