FEBRUARY IS NATIONAL CHILDREN'S DENTAL HEALTH MONTH

The annual observance of children's dental health began as a one-day event on February 3, 1941. In 1981, the program was extended to a month-long celebration known today as National Children's Dental Health Month. A variety of resources are available through the Health Promotion Resource Center to include as a part of your Dental Health Month activities.

Videos: Most of these are accompanied by a teacher's guide.

- Brushing with Dudley and Dee Dee 6 minutes, suitable for preK
- **Dudley's Visit to the Dentist** 8 minutes, for use with preK-grade 1
- Adventures of Wiggly Tooth 12 minutes, intended for grades K-1
- **Dudley's Classroom Adventure** 9 minutes, intended for grades 2-3
- *The Haunted Mouth* 12 minutes, best used with grades 3-6

<u>Model</u>: Mr. Gross Mouth illustrates the effects of tobacco products on the gums and teeth. Appropriate for students in middle and high school.

FEBRUARY IS ALSO AMERICAN HEART MONTH

Cardiovascular diseases, including stroke, are our nation's No. 1 killer. While not all risk factors for heart disease can be changed, some can, including smoking, physical inactivity, high blood cholesterol, high blood pressure and overweight. During American Heart Month, consider featuring activities that focus on reducing risk factors, such as food selection and label reading.

Label-Ease

This video reviews facts contained on food labels. It distinguishes between nutrients people need to eat in adequate quantities and those associated with chronic disease in excess. The video describes a simple procedure to compare products and select a nutritious food item. Ideas for using the video as part of a classroom supermarket tour are available. Lead Poisoning and Your Child - A full-color brochure produced by the US Environmental Protection Agency. Specific suggestions are included to protect the whole family against high levels of lead. The brochure unfolds to a small poster. Intended for parents and family members. Available in English and Spanish.

Stop, Drop & Roll! - A one-page flyer emphasizing the correct safety procedure in the event clothing catches on fire. Intended for use with early elementary school students.
