OBSERVE THE GREAT AMERICAN SMOKEOUT THIS NOVEMBER

Millions of people quit smoking for a day or longer during the Great American Smokeout, held on the Third Thursday of November. Plan to observe this event by including information on the health effects of smoking in your lessons or programs. The following videos represent a selection of those available from the Health Promotion Resource Center.

I Can't Breathe. A Smoker's Story

Pam Laffin, a 31-year-old mother of two young girls died from emphysema. In this program, Pam tells why she started smoking and what it was like to learn she had emphysema. The video and moderator's guide are designed to help lead classroom discussions with students about the consequences of cigarette smoking. The program has been created specifically for young people aged 11 to 14 years. The product is a joint effort between the Massachusetts Department of Public Health and CDC's Office on Smoking and Health.

VHS, 20 minutes Request: AV S40

Smoke Screeners

Examines the role of smoking and cigarettes in movies. The use of cigarettes as props and their advertising are targeted. On-screen pause prompts suggest appropriate times for discussion. A moderator's guide suggests discussion topics and supplemental activities. A 1999 production of the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention. Use with students in grades 6-9.

VHS, 15 minutes Request: AV S36

Smokeless... NOT Harmless

This video looks back at the many tactics used to sell smokeless tobacco over the past century. Like a virus, smokeless tobacco marketing has spread around the world, from Venezuela to India, and beyond. Slides of the physical effects of tobacco are graphic. Cosponsored by the National Cancer Institute and the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention, this video is most appropriate for high school students.

VHS, 5 minutes Request: AV S39

The Health Promotion Resource Center offers information and health promotion materials such as videos for loan and accompanying handouts on a wide range of health issues to residents of towns contracting with the Department of Health Services for health education.
