CONNECTIONS: HIGH SCHOOL EQUIVALENCY PREPARATION/LIFE SKILLS EDUCATION

OVERVIEW

- Connections is a program for out-ofschool youth sponsored by the Bergen County Division of Family Guidance. It is located on the campus of Bergen Community College at the Meadowlands in Lyndhurst, NJ.
- Connections helps students obtain their high school equivalency diploma, secure admission to college or other training programs and/or prepare for employment.
- The program emphasizes basic skills, habits and attitudes that are appropriate for the world of work.
- There is no charge to participate in <u>Connections.</u>
- The staff an academic teacher, arts instructor, case manager, vocational counselor and program administrator address individual needs by providing a structured day program with individualized support and guidance.
- Family Guidance resources such as individual and family counseling and learning assessments are available to Connections students on an as needed basis.

GETTING STARTED

Who is eligible?

Bergen County residents 16 through 21 years old who are no longer enrolled in high school. We encourage students to sign out of school only after they have been accepted at **Connections.**

How do I apply?

Contact staff at (201) 937-7236 to schedule an appointment for a personal interview. Placement testing is given to determine your strengths in each of the tests on the High School Equivalency Examination: Mathematics, Reading, Writing, Science and Social Studies.

How long is the Program?

It varies based on the individual's academic skill level. The average length of stay is four to six months.

What are the hours?

The hours are from 9:00 am to 3:00 pm, Monday through Friday, throughout the year.
