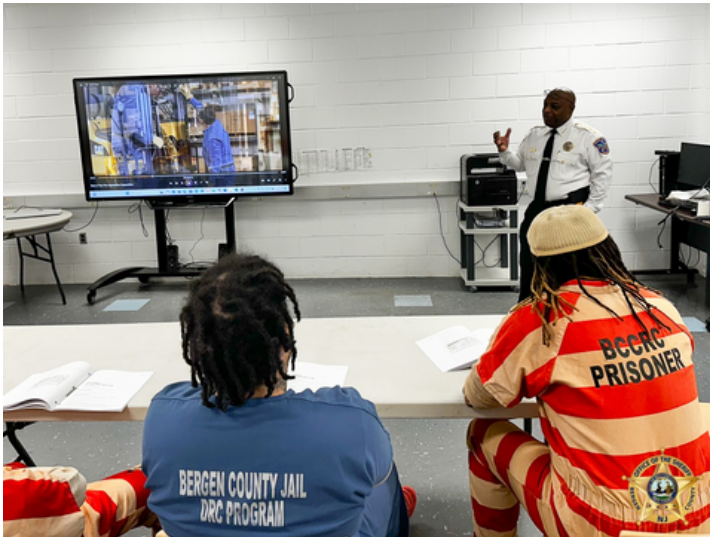

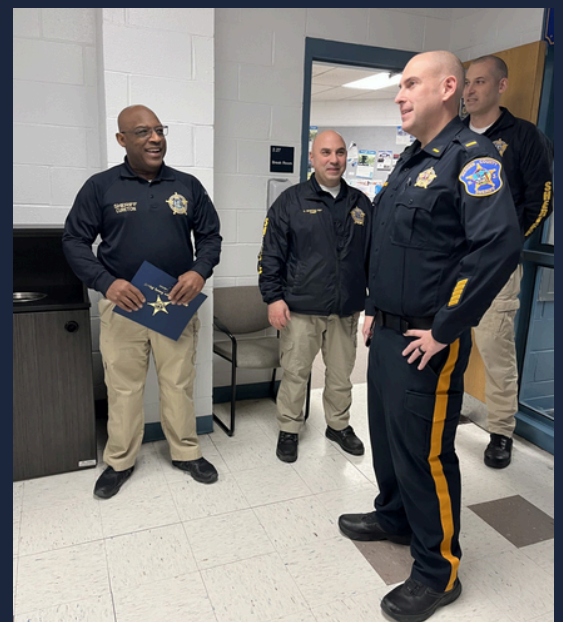
February Forklift Session at the Bergen County Correctional & Rehabilitation Center:

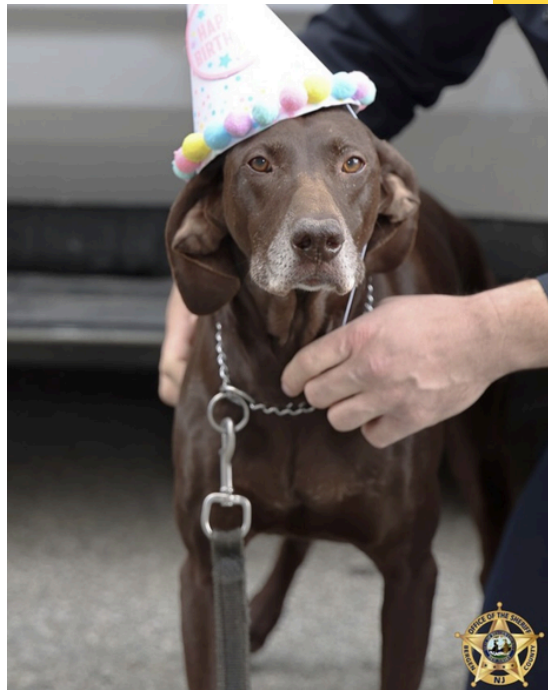
